# Art Prize winner shares landscape quilting tips

Ann Loveless, who won Art Prize twice with her landscape quilts, will share her techniques with area quilters. The northern Michigan artist will talk at **7 p.m Sept. 11 at the United Methodist Church of the Dunes.**, **717 Sheldon, Grand Haven**. The Frankfort textile artist and her husband, Steve, a photographer, own State of the Art gallery in Beulah. They use a process they call PhotoFiber, a mixed media of photography and textiles.

Their inspiration and designs come from nature. Favorite subjects are the birch trees, flowers, ferns, sunsets, sparkling water and glistening snow all found in Michigan.

Loveless' 2013 Art Prize winner " Sleeping Bear Dune Lakeshore " hangs in the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore in Empire. Her 2015 "Northwood Awakening" is now on display in the University of Michigan Hospital main lobby in Ann Arbor.

The event is sponsored by the Lighthouse Quilt Guild in Grand Haven and Patchers at the Lakeshore (PALS) in Muskegon. It is open to the public. Cost is \$10 for non-guild members. Members must have membership card or nametag.
