


FROM YOUR 2017 QUILT SHOW BOARD:

ON CHIVES & UFO'S

Musings from co-chair, Joy

I enjoy gardening - in the springtime. My flower garden is filled with perennials because they don't mind being messed around with in the spring and do just fine when I ignore them the rest of the year. Chives are great because they do triple duty, they have pretty blossoms, you can cook with them, and they seem to repel some critters that want to snack on some of my other perennials.

The spiky texture of the flowers and the fragile looking stems make me think of a UFO stashed away in my Sewing Dungeon. Methinks the chives are my inspiration to work on another block ...

My Sewing Dungeon gets the same sort of attention my garden gets. A couple of times a year I dig around in there and organize until everything looks just so. The rest of the year I enjoy the space, working feverishly on projects that inspire me. The problem is, they inspire me until the next new idea comes

along and then I start yet another project. Soon my Sewing Dungeon is back to looking like a messy basement with fabrics and tools spread hither and yon and with new UFOs cluttering up the space. Just like my perennials, they need to be weeded and divided so that other people can enjoy the fruits of my labors (or at least I can finish up some quilts).

Over the summer I plan to reorganize my Sewing Dungeon (yet again), hoping that time it will stay organized even in the frenzy of my creative spells. Maybe I will even get a couple of UFOs finished. Now where is that applique flower sampler buried, anyway? Does it have any chives on it? Hmmm...





We encourage you to continue making your blocks and bringing them to the meetings. They generate a lot of interest but our numbers are down a bit. Don't become discouraged, keep trying.

Remember this experience will greatly benefit your quilt making skills and give you the confidence to move on to more challenging projects.

As promised things are about to get a little more challenging. There are not as many of my very tedious drawings to help you along and the instructions are not as detailed. Just pay attention to your details and remember the rules you have been following. **Don't forget your accent fabric**, one very beautiful block last month caught all the judge's eyes, it was their first choice—alas, no accent fabric...

Journey to Japan JULY BLOCK OF THE MONTH Kurume Kasuri Haba ni Masumon

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A: four 1½" sq.

two 4½ sq.

Fabric B: two 1½" sq.

two 2½" x 1½" sq.

two 4½" x 1½" sq.


Borders: two 8½" x 1" two 9½" x 1"

Fabric C: Same as B

Sewing Instructions:

- Sew one A 1½" sq. to one C 1½" sq. Sew one C 1½" sq. to one A 1½" sq. Make a four patch.
- Sew one A $1\frac{1}{2}$ " sq. to one B $1\frac{1}{2}$ " sq. Sew one B $1\frac{1}{2}$ " sq. to one A $1\frac{1}{2}$ " sq. Make a four patch.
- 3) Each four patch should measure 2½" sq. each
- 4) Sew one B 2½" x 1½" on opposite sides of AB units. Sew one B 4½" on top and bottom of unit.
- 5) Sew one C 2½" x 1½" on opposite sides of AC units. Sew one C 4½" on top and bottom of unit.
- 6) Unit AB and Unit AC should measure 4½" each.
- 7) Sew one A 4½" sq. to unit AB. Sew one A 4½" sq. to unit AC.
- 8) Sew unit AB and AC together as a four patch. This unit should measure 8½" sq.
- 9) Sew one 8½" border to each side of unit. Sew one 9½" border to top and bottom of the unit.

The block should measure 9½" square. <u>Pin</u> your name and phone number to the corner of your block. Turn in at the July meeting.

Journey to Japan AUGUST BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Chigai Kaku (Different angles)

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A: two 7" x 1½" one 5" x 1½" one 2½" x 1½"

one 2" x 1½"

Fabric C: two 5" x 2" two 3½" x 2"

two 3" sq. one 2½" sq

Fabric B: same as A Sewing Instructions:

Side units:

1) Sew one C 5" x 2" to one A 2" x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", press, this is unit AC1


- 2) Sew one C 5" x 2" to one B 2" x 11/2", press, this is unit BC1
- 3) Sew one A 7" x 1½" to unit AC1 using a part seam (see diagram). Repeat with one B 7" x 1½" to BC1.


4) Sew C 3" square to the end of unit AC1 and BC1.


Center unit:

- 1) Sew one A and one B 2½" x 1½" to top and bottom of C 2½" sq. This is unit BCA.
- 2) Following the diagram, sew on A 7" x 1½" to the center BCA unit, using a part seam, end your seam as shown in the diagram. Repeat on the other side with one B 7" x 1½"
- 3) Pull the unsewn part of strips A and B away and sew a C 3 1/2" x 2" to the ends of the unit.

4) Take the remaining A and B 5" x 1½", flip the unsewn pieces and complete the block by sewing all remaining seams. Press.Side units
