It is that time once again for the 2nd Biennual Threads of Friendship Quilt Show, so put it on your calendar for May 12 & 13, 2017 at the Fellowship Reformed Church 4200 East Apple Avenue. We will have two raffle quilts, a new challenge quilt, new vendors and much more. We wouldn't have a great show without all of you who volunteer and your beautiful quilts, so start thinking about what you would like to put in the show and what you would like to volunteer for.

Patchers at the Lakeshore 2017 CHALLENGE QUILT RULES Kay Wilton, Chair

- 1. Size is 20" x 20" Quilts outside of this size will not qualify for judging.
- 2. Must be three (3) layers top, batting, backing and quilt must be bound.
- 3. Must be quilted by hand, machine, or both.
- 4. The challenge must be an individual entry (no bees).
- 5. No names may appear on the front of the challenge quilt.
- 6. Entry must have a registration form.
- 7. Challenge fabric is provided for a cost of \$3.00, for a 9" by 40" piece.
- 8. Additional fabric may be purchased from Challenge Chair for \$12.00 per yard
- 9. Must have a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric within the quilt, not just the binding or border.
- 10.2017 Challenge quilt must have at least one spool. It may be pieced, appliqued or 3 dimensional.





Journey to Japan NOVEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH

lyo Kasuri Tsunagi Masumon (linked squares pattern) designed by Susan Briscoe

Fabric requirements:

Fabric A: two 2½" square Fabric C: two 6½" x 2" and two 9½" x 2"

Fabric B: two 4½ " x 2 ½" Fabric D: three 2 ½" square

Sewing Instructions: Precise ½" seam allowance, sew with small stitches (13-15"). Following the diagram, lay out all of your pieces in their proper position before piecing them together.


Sew one A 2½" square + one D 2½" square + one A 2½" square. This A-D-A strip measures 2½" x 6½".


Sew one B 4½" x 2" to the end of one D 2½" square. Repeat once. Strip measure 2½" x 6½".

Sew one B-D strip to each sides of the A-D-A unit. This middle unit measures 6 1/2" square.

Sew one 6 1/2" strip to each sides of the block.

Sew one 9 ½" strip to the top and bottom of the block. This block measures 9 ½" square.





December Block of the Month Yotsu Masu (four square measures) designed by Susan Briscoe

Fabric requirements:

Fabric A: four 5" x 1" strips

Fabric B: repeat cuts in Fabric A

four 4" x 1" strips

Fabric C: eight 4" x 1" strips

four 3" x 1" strips eight 3" x 1" strip

eight 2" x 1" strips Fabric D: four 1" squares four 1" squares

Sewing Instructions: Precise ½" seam allowance, sew with small stitches (13-15"). Following the diagram, lay out all of your pieces in their proper position before piecing them together. You will make four small blocks to be combined into one large block.

- Make center strip by sewing 1" squares together. A + D + A
- Sew two A 2" strips on both sides of center strip. This unit measures 2" square.
- Sew two B 2" strips on top and bottom of the center block.
- Sew two B 3" strips on both sides of the center block. This unit measures 3" square.
- Sew two C 3" strips on top and bottom of the center block.
- Sew two C 4" strips on both sides of the center block. This unit measure 4" square.
- Sew two A 4" strips on the top and bottom of the center block.
- Sew two A 5" strips on both sides of the center block. This unit measures 5" square.
- Make three more squares alternating the order of the A and B strips.
- Sew two squares together and then sew the other two together.
- Sew the two rectangles together. Block measures 9½" square.
