
These adorable little stylized leaves are a treat to make and feast for the eye. You will learn the basics that will take you soaring into even greater projects.



BeeKeeper Buzz from Su Palmer



Plus we had ten quilts that were started at our May workshop turned in. Our grand total as of July 31st is 277 quilts. We have faith that we will have at least 350 - 400 ready to donate at our October 3rd meeting! We look forward to seeing the kits we handed out come back finished and find out what you thought of the patterns we picked. We put a lot of time and work into making kits, we



hope you enjoy making them. We are still in need of cotton fabric yardage to be used for backings, which are our biggest challenge. Keep up the great work ladies! We know lots of you are working very hard to help our guild help these organizations.

The organizations invited to receive baby quilts this year are: Catholic Charities, The Rescue Mission; Women's and Children's Division, Every Women's Place, Love Inc., and Muskegon Pregnancy Services. We are hoping they will all participate.

"Baby Quilts" is our guild's service project, intended to give back to people of the community who have less and to give something that, hopefully, will be cherished for many years to come. Our love of quilting is passed on, to those we do not know, who may someday take up quilting and pay it forward. In order to receive a baby quilt pin, a member is required to turn in two baby quilts for each year. We are blessed to have some members who have far exceed that requirement. They pick up kits every meeting and return quilts every meeting, and sometimes not just one or two. This is how our numbers grow and we hope many of you that have not donated will consider making two quilts a goal for the coming year.

As a reminder, if you have quilts to donate we would really like to receive as many as possible at the September meeting so we can get a count and start preparing them for the receiving organizations. At our October meeting which is always busy. Of course we will accept quilts additional quilts at the October meeting.

As always, we so appreciate all you do for us and the Baby Quilt Committee.



The **Show and Tell** part of our meetings is extremely important. Many PALS members want to show their talents and workmanship of their quilts, and many other PALS members want to see those quilts. Consider these thoughts when attending the guild meeting. <u>Please</u> stay till the end of the meeting to be part of the PALS Show and Tell.



Journey to Japan SEPTEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH Yoseqi Juji Masu (cross squares)

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A: eight 2" squares two 3 ½" x 3" one 3 ½" x 6½"

Sewing Instructions:

Following the last diagram, lay out all of your pieces in their proper position before piecing them together. **Corner Units**

1) Sew one A 2" to one B 2". Repeat to make eight AB units.

2) Make four 4 patch with the AB units. Each unit measures 3½" square

Middle Units

Sew one A $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" to one B $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2". Repeat once to make two units. Each unit measures $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square **Block**

Sew one corner unit to each end of a middle unit. Repeat twice to make two rows.

Sew one B $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" to each end of A $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Follow diagram below and sew the rows together. Block measures 9 ½" square.

OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH Yotsu Kumi Sujikai

Fabric Requirements: Fabric A: four 3 ³⁄₄' squares two 3 ¹⁄₂" x 3"

Fabric B: one 5 x 1³/₄" one 3 ³/₄" x 1 ³/₄"

Fabric B: eight 2" squares

four 3½" x 2"

Fabrics C, D, E: same as B

Sewing Instructions:

Sew one B 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " to one 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' squares. Repeat with C, D, and E 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and remaining 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' squares. Each unit measures 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5".

Sew the B, C, D, E 5 x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " to each of the above units.

Check diagram and make sure all pieces are properly oriented.

Sew the four patch together to create the block. Block measures 9 ½" square.
