Waiting for Spring Mystery Quilt Clue Three

*Step One:

- *Fabric A: Cut 9 ~ 4" strips subcut into 84 ~ 4" squares ~set aside 41 for Step Two
- *Fabric D: Cut 5 ~ 4" strips ~ subcut into 43 ~ 4" squares ~mark center diagonal line on back of each square



*Pair 43 ~ Color A and Color D squares and sew seams $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the center diagonal line. And then cut apart on the line for 86 *HST* units. *Square up to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " if needed. Place in zip bag labeled **Clue #3a**.

*Step Two

*Fabric A: Take 41 ~ 4" squares from Step One ~ Cut on the diagonal to make 82 *HST* pieces



*Pair the HST pieces with the HST units from Clue #2 to make 82 HST/QST units

*Square up to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " if needed.

*Place in a zip bag marked Clue #3b.

*Step Three

*Fabric A: Cut 14 ~ 2" WOF strips – place in zip bag labeled Clue #7

HST = Half Square Triangle *QST* = Quarter Square Triangle
