In February our guild meeting will be a sewing bee to work on charity quilts. You can bring your machines, sewing supplies and fabric from your stash to work on quilts. We will have lots of fabrics to share! For those who don't want to bring their machines there will be fabric that needs to be cut for take home kits.

Quilts of Valor Cathy Baker

We will be presenting our 2018 quilts to the local QOV coordinator at the March general meeting. She will talk about QOV and its history and mission.

We will have another block drive for QOV. The 2019 block will be a Friendship Star. The block should be 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished (12 x 12 finished) with a white background. These blocks, collected throughout the year, will be pieced into quilts by PALS volunteers in late fall. Fabric used should be high quality 100% "quilt-weight" prewashed cotton fabric. Challenge Quilts

Challenge fabric will be available at each meeting at the Quilt Show table. The red batik is \$4.00 for a fat quarter. The rules are printed below and will be given with the fabric at time of purchase.

- 1. Size 20" X 20 " -- Quilts outside this size will not qualify for judging
- 2. Must be 3 layers--- top, batting and backing. Also must be bound
- 3. Must be quilted by hand or machine
- 4. The challenge must be completed by one person
- 5. No names on the front of the quilt
- 6. Entry must have a registration form
- 7. Challenge fabric is provided at a cost of \$4.00 per fat quarter
- 8. Additional fabric may be purchased from the Challenge Chair
- 9. Entry must have a recognizable amount of the challenge fabric within the quilt design, not just the binding or backing
- 10. 2019 Challenge quilt must have at least **one** heart. It may be pieced, appliqued, or three dimensional.

What You Need to Know:

- Only active PALS members may enter guilts in the show
- PALS members may each enter TWO quilts for display
- Entry forms are due on or before April 8, 2019 at the PALS general meeting. No late entries will be accepted. NO EXCEPTIONS>
- All entry forms must be accompanied by a photo of the quilt for identification purposes. This does not
 need to be a professional photo (a home printer copy will work.) Beginning in February, a member of the
 Quilt Show board will be available to take a photo for your entry if necessary. PHOTOS WILL NOT BE
 RETURNED
- Ribbons will be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the following categories:

Large - 61" x 61" or larger Small - up to 60" x 60" Miniature - up to 20' x 20" Guild Challenge - 20" x 20"

There will be separate categories for:

Hand Quilted Long Arm Quilted Domestic Machine Quilted

- Ribbons will also be given for Best in Show and Viewer's Choice.
- No monetary awards will be given.
- Quilt entries will be accepted at the church ONLY at the following times:

Wednesday, May 8, from 5 pm to 7 pm Thursday, May 9, from 7:30 am to 9 am

- Please fold all quilts backing side out, with lower right corner of the front turned back. We will demonstrate folding at meetings as the show nears.
- No guilts will be offered for sale at the show
- PALS Quilt Guild and Fellowship Reformed Church are not responsible for loss, theft, or damage to any
 item displayed at the show. Normal precautions will be taken to protect belongings at all times. The
 church will be securely locked when not in use. Quilt owners who desire insurance must provide it
 themselves.
- PALS Quilt Guild is not responsible for any quilt which is not picked up by 6:00 pm Saturday, May 11. No
 quilt will be released after the show without the claim tag received at drop-off. If your quilt will be picked
 up by someone else, that person MUST have the claim tag. NO EXCEPTIONS!


