This is a colorful journey through the creative process. Jane will be bringing many quilts and accessories made with *Free Spirit* fabrics. 



Fat eighths 25 cents
Fat quarters 50 cents
Yardage \$1.00 per yard
Books and patterns \$1.00 to \$2.00
Tote Bags \$18.00
PALS pins \$5.00
Tumblers \$10.00

Charity Quilts

It sure has been fun to see all the cute quilts come in each month to be donated for charity quilts. As of June we have collected 206 beautiful quilts. Thank you for you generous donations! The October charity quilt meeting and distribution will be here before you know it. More kids' quilts are needed. We encourage you to finish your quilts and turn them in at the July meeting or at the picnic in August. We won't be collecting quilts at the combined meeting with Lighthouse guild in September.

There will be a Sew Along for last minute finishing up of quilts on Saturday, September 28 at Abbi Mays quilt shop from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Come and sew with us! We will be collecting quilts then, too.

This year we have six charities that will receive quilts coming up at our October guild meeting: Love Inc, Every Woman's Place, Women and Family Rescue Mission Muskegon, Catholic Charities of West Michigan, Muskegon Pregnancy Services and we are partnering with Fellowship Church to donate 16 quilts for One Day with God. We still need donations. Come and pick up a pattern and/or kit at the next meeting.

Come see us at the July meeting. We will be renewing the PALS Quilts of Valor group membership this month. If you want to become/renew your individual membership, I will need your \$5.00 this month. We have made up some time-saving block kits for our QOV group projects. We've precut the fabric for you. You can get these blocks for \$2.00 each. The money collected from these blocks will be used to purchase backing fabric for our QOV quilts. We also have one kit made up for piecing.

The 2019 block drive is the Friendship Star. The block should be 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished (12" x 12" finished) using a white background. Please see the QOV page on our PALS website for fabric requirements. The blocks, collected throughout the year, will be pieced into quilts by PALS volunteers in late fall.

Quilt Show Financials

Our 2019 Threads of Friendship Quilt Show financial report is as follows:

Income: \$10,131.90 Expenses: 3,092.82 Profit: 7,039.08

The Expense Budget was set at \$4,550 and all of our committees were very diligent. They spent \$1,457.18 UNDER budget.

A total of 559 people attended the show and 210 quilt raffle tickets were sold. Mary Warden bought the winning ticket for "Blue Beauty".

We would like to give a great big "thank you" to all of you who supported PALS' third quilt show. The funds that were raised will support us for the next two years by helping to pay for teachers and activities we all can enjoy.
