Primitive Crazy Star

10 9" fabric blocks - 5 light, 5 dark or 5 of 1 print, 5 contrasting printRotary cutterSewing machineRulerUsual sewing suppliesCutting board10 sticky notes and pins

Stack fabrics evenly on top of each other, all facing up, alternating light and dark colors. Make extra copies of the star pattern and place one on top of the stack, about $\frac{1}{2}$ " in from the edge on all four sides. Pay attention to the cutting sequences and be sure to cut all the way to the edges.

Pin through all 10 pieces of fabric in each Section before cutting. After each cut make sure to move pin head or shaft and straighten cutting lines. Keep all Sections pinned.

Cut on line A to B.

Cut on line B to C.

Cut on line D to E.

Cut on line E to A.

Label section 8 and CAREFULLY remove from cutting area. Don't disturb the rest of the fabric stacks.

Cut on line C to D.

Pull apart slightly the stacks and label all according to the numbers on the pattern.

Shuffle:

- Section 1 take the top piece and put it on the bottom. Make sure to put the # on the top piece of fabric after shuffling.
- Section 2 take the top 2 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 3 take the top 3 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 4 take the top 4 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 5 take the top 5 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 6 take the top 6 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 7 take the top 7 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 8 take the top 8 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 9 take the top 9 pieces and put them on the bottom.
- Section 10 Leave as is.

Sew Section 1 to 2 with triangle ¹/₄" tip hanging out to the right. Sew and press toward Section 2. Line up Section 3 with edge of Section 2, sew ¹/₄" seam allowance. Press toward 3.

Sew Section 6 to Section 7, press to 6. Then, sew Section 5 to Section 6, press toward 5. **Try to** align the seams to be as straight as possible on the inside seams. Disregard the outside edges for the time being. They will be trimmed last. (What you want is a straight line from edge to edge.)

Sew Section 4 to Section 8. Try to pinch the edges so as to find the centers of these pieces, line up the pinch marks, and sew. Also, sew Sections 9 - 10.

Press and trim.

Sew Section 4/8 to Section 9/10.

Press and trim. (You will probably have to trim both sides of these segments.)

Sew Section 5/6/7 to Section 4/8/9/10.


Press and trim.

Sew Section 1/2/3 to 4/8/9/10 to complete the block.

Press. Do not trim outside edges until all the blocks are finished.

Trim all blocks to the smallest one making sure there is at least a FULL ¼" seam allowance at all the points. There can be a larger area between the outside edge and your points. Your blocks can be trimmed square, rectangle...or any way you want to place them.

Arrange and sew together as you would like ..
