I found Pat Race in Grand Haven and took a class from her. I didn't know anyone else who was quilting and didn't know anything about guilds either. I think that was around 2002.

Fast forward 10 years to 2012... Rae Simerick was doing a little quilting and wanting to learn more. She decided that LouAnn and I needed to learn with her. We went to AQS in Grand Rapids, found a pattern and I bought fabric there to make a queen-size quilt! Rae inquired about classes at Joann's, and the instructor agreed to have a class with the 3 of us and teach us the pattern we had bought. We learned a lot of the basic things we needed to know, and all completed our guilts and then we joined PALS.... and caught the quilting bug!

Please welcome our vendor for this month, Abby Jansen from Savasana Quilts in Grand Rapids. She will have 3 tables of goodies for us to purchase.

We will continue taking sign-ups for the Flurry quilt block swap. You have the choice of doing a smaller, 4-block wall hanging or table runner or the full 16-block quilt.

You can find the FREE pattern at www.unitednotions.com/fp flurry.pdf or pick one up when you sign up.

PLEASE NOTE: this pattern uses a panel for the cornerstones. You will need to figure out which fabrics you want in your 4 corners. You will have enough for the 2-1/2" sashing cornerstones from our swapping. The pattern also gives cutting requirements for 16 different blocks and those included with this newsletter are for using the same fabric for all 16 blocks.

There are also instructions available for 4-block wall hanging or table runner.

Plan on bringing your first and your most recent quilt you've finished or are working on. Board members will be sharing theirs also. This should be a fun night to see many beautiful quilts made by your fellow quild members and hear some inspiring stories.

Recipe submitted by Joy Lamphere (made for February meeting)

White Chocolate Cheesecake Mousse

Low Carb/Sugar Free

Ingredients:

- 1 cup + 1/4 cup Heavy Whipping Cream, divided
- 1/3 cup powdered sugar substitute (Swerve Recommended), divided
- 1 ½ tsp vanilla extract, divided
- 8 oz Cream cheese, softened
- 1 oz cocoa butter, melted and cooled

Instructions:

- Beat 1 cup of the HWC with 3 TBL of the sweetener and ½ tsp vanilla extract until it reaches stiff peaks stage, set aside
- In another bowl, beat the cream cheese with the remaining sweetener and vanilla extract until smooth. Add in the melted cocoa butter and beat again until smooth. Mixture will be thick.
- Add the remaining HWC to the cream cheese mixture and beat until combined. If the mixture is still very stiff, add another TBL of HWC.
- Fold the Whipped Cream into the cream cheese mixture until well combined. Spoon or pipe into dessert cups.
- Top with Chia Raspberry Jam or other desired topping

Chia Raspberry Jam

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups fresh or frozen raspberries
- 3 TBL sugar substitute (Swerve) adjust to taste
- 1 TBL water
- 1 TBL Chia Seeds
- ½ tsp vanilla extract

Instructions

- Add raspberries, sweetener and water into a small saucepan
- Bring mixture to a boil and then reduce heat to simmer
- Stir in chia seeds and simmer or about 15 minutes until thickened, stirring occasionally
- Remove from heat and add vanilla
- Allow to cool. Store in covered container in the refrigerator.

"Flurry" by Kate Spain - Fabic Requirements

Quilt is 55" x 65" These requirements are for 16 blocks to swap.

Quilt Fabric Requirements Gifts & Pieced Border: 1-3/4 yards Ribbon: ¾ yard Background: 2-1/4 yards of white on white fabric No off-whites or creams Binding: 5/8 yard Backing: 4 yards	Quilt Fabric Cutting Gifts & Pieced Border: 8 - 4" x WOF strips(Width Of Fabric)
This pattern calls for "One Flurry Panel."	20 – 2-1/2" x 10-1/2"
I'm sure this is no longer available. This is	12 – 2-1/2" x 8-1/2"
Step 1 (A) in the pattern. You will need to decide	16 – 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"
which fabric(s) you want to use in the four corners	40 – 2-1/2" x 2-1/2"
For 1(B) and 1(C) in the pattern, you will use the	15 – 2" x WOF strips
2-1/2" squares of swapped ribbon fabrics.	Set aside 11 strips
	Subcut 4 – 2" x 42-1/2"

Binding: 7 - 2-1/2" x WOF strips

For <u>each</u> block you swap, you must also include 8 - 2 - 1/2" x 2 - 1/2" squares of your <u>gifts fabric</u> to be used in the pieced border. Also include 1 - 2 - 1/2" x 2 - 1/2" square of your <u>ribbon fabric</u> for <u>each</u> block you swap. You will receive 16 of these back, but will only need 9 for the sashing cornerstones.
