For bagging the Flurry Swap Blocks:

- \*Use Gallon Zip Bags, one for each block to be swapped, including your own. Put your name on the outside of each large bag.
- \*In a Snack bag, one for each block swapped, place: 8 matching 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares of "gift" fabric and one 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square ribbon fabric.

# "Flurry" by Kate Spain - Fabic Requirements

Quilt is 55" x 65" These requirements are for 16 blocks to swap.

Quilt Fabric Requirements Gifts & Pieced Border: 1-3/4 yards Ribbon: ¾ yard Background: 2-1/4 yards of white on white fabric No off-whites or creams Binding: 5/8 yard Backing: 4 yards	Quilt Fabric Cutting  Gifts & Pieced Border:  8 - 4" x WOF strips(Width Of Fabric)
This pattern calls for "One Flurry Panel."	20 – 2-1/2" x 10-1/2"
I'm sure this is no longer available. This is	12 – 2-1/2" x 8-1/2"
Step 1 (A) in the pattern. You will need to decide	16 – 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"
which fabric(s) you want to use in the four corners.	40 – 2-1/2" x 2-1/2"
For 1(B) and 1(C) in the pattern, you will use the	15 – 2" x WOF strips
2-1/2" squares of swapped ribbon fabrics.	Set aside 11 strips
	Subcut 4 – 2" x 42-1/2"

**Binding:** 7 - 2 - 1/2" x WOF strips

For <u>each</u> block you swap, you must also include 8 - 2 - 1/2" x 2 - 1/2" squares of your <u>aifts fabric</u> to be used in the pieced border. Also include 1 - 2 - 1/2" x 2 - 1/2" square of your <u>ribbon fabric</u> for <u>each</u> block you swap. You will receive 16 of these back, but will only need 9 for the sashing cornerstones.
