"Flurry" by Kate Spain - Fabic Requirements

Quilt is 55" x 65" These requirements are for 16 blocks to swap.

Quilt Fabric Requirements Gifts & Pieced Border: 1-3/4 yards Ribbon: ¾ yard Background: 2-1/4 yards of white on white fabric <u>No</u> off-whites or creams Binding: 5/8 yard Backing: 4 yards	Quilt Fabric Cutting Gifts & Pieced Border: $8 - 4'' \times WOF$ strips(Width Of Fabric) subcut $32 - 4'' \times 8-1/2''$ $8 - 2 - 1/2'' \times WOF$ strips subcut $128 - 2 - 1/2'' \times 2 - 1/2''$ Ribbon: $3 - 2 - 12'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut $48 - 2 - 1/2'' \times 2 - 1/2''$ $4 - 1 - 1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut $16 - 1 - 1/2'' \times 8 - 1/2''$ Background: $18 - 2 - 1/2'' \times WOF$ strips Subcut $3 - 2 - 1/2'' \times 42 - 1/2''$
This pattern calls for "One Flurry Panel."	20 – 2-1/2" x 10-1/2"
I'm sure this is no longer available. This is	12 – 2-1/2" x 8-1/2"
Step 1 (A) in the pattern. You will need to decide	16 – 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"
which fabric(s) you want to use in the four corners	. 40 – 2-1/2" x 2-1/2"
For 1(B) and 1(C) in the pattern, you will use the	15 – 2" x WOF strips
2-1/2" squares of swapped ribbon fabrics.	Set aside 11 strips
	Subcut 4 – 2" x 42-1/2"

Binding: $7 - 2 - 1/2'' \times WOF$ strips

For <u>each</u> block you swap, you must also include $8 - 2 \cdot 1/2'' \ge 2 \cdot 1/2''$ squares of your <u>aifts fabric</u> to be used in the pieced border. Also include $1 - 2 \cdot 1/2'' \ge 2 \cdot 1/2''$ square of your <u>ribbon fabric</u> for <u>each</u> block you swap. You will receive 16 of these back, but will only need 9 for the sashing cornerstones.
