### Hello friends,

Welcome Fall, cooler weather, trees showing off their special colors. Love this time of year!

As most of you know, we have cancelled our upcoming Quilt Show for May of 2021. Another blow to quilters was the recent cancellation of the AQS Quilt show in Grand Rapids in August of 2021. I came across some ideas of things to do or things to keep you busy in place of attending these shows.

### What To Do When Your Quilt Show Is Cancelled:

Your favorite quilt show has been cancelled. Whatever will you do now? Here are some suggestions based on the activities that you would have done at the show.

### Suggestions that will save you money:

Buy some fabric from your local quilt shop for your fabric library. You don't have to "need" it, you just need to love it! Chat with the store owner about trends in fabrics and colors to learn what you would have learned at a quilt show. Take an online class. You would have taken a class at the quilt show anyway. Buy a book that you've been wanting and take the time to read it! Buy from an online quilt shop that you haven't tried before. This will expand your future choices. Donate to your Guild or make something for community service. Add a new tool. Maybe something you have always worked around in the past such as perfect circles.

### Suggestions that are free:

Join a new list or Facebook group online. Email someone from your Guild that you've always admired and ask them a good discussion question. Remember, she is probably home as well. Make something you would never try. Being at home is a good time to learn from failure. Try your nemesis – such as curves! Host a reunion of your quilt show friends over video conferencing. Do Show 'n Tell or sip wine together. Volunteer for a committee for next year's show. They need you!!

### A Cartoon for Quilters: The Story of Mrs. Bobbins By Abby Glassenberg/whileshenaps.com. 05/29/2017 (Continued from PALS October Newsletter)

Many quilters see themselves and their friends in Mrs. Bobbins. Designer and teacher Cheryl Sieboda understands well why the cartoons have become so popular. "What I see is brilliant branding towards the largest segment of the quilting market. Every quilter has said most of these things," Sieboda remarks. "The ladies in the two very traditional guilds I belong to certainly have said everything in these cartoons."

Others are bothered by the gender roles depicted in some of the Mrs. Bobbins cartoons that can feel outdated. "She is definitely based on the stereotyped old school quilter," says Icenogle of her character. "It's kind of what I observed in most of the quilters I talked to from the Midwest. That's kind of what people are joking about."

Icenogle is considering creating a character foil for Mrs. Bobbins, a friend who is different and modern, but until now hasn't pursued it. "To be honest, I just don't think I'm immersed enough into the more feminist quilter culture to even know that is a thing. My knowledge of quilting is limited to just what I see and most of what I see is the stereotyped older lady quilter."

Mrs. Bobbins has become a driving force in Icenogle's illustration career. The web comic helped her pay her way through a master's degree program in occupational therapy. It led to a book, published by C&T in 2010, as well as a 2012 wall calendar. Last year (2016), Northcott, a major manufacturer of quilting cotton, licensed Mrs. Bobbins for fabrics that will be released soon. A selection of the cartoons is also available as machinery embroidery designs.

"Looking back and looking at all the things I've drawn in the past I don't think I ever expected that it would take off more than just a very local crowd, like here is our Kansas City blog and I think we're going to maybe reach people within a 200-mile radius of here," laughs Icenogle. "But here's somebody in Australia and here's somebody in England who wants to buy something with Mrs. Bobbins on it and so that was kind of like, 'oh my goodness.' And now with Facebook I'm pretty much getting interest all over the place which I never expected that to happen.
