

Sewing Machine Pedal Stop



Materials needed:

2 Pieces of Non-Slip shelf Liner
7" X 9" – *size may vary
2 1/2" binding strip
Piece of fabric
9" X 11" – *size may vary
Scrap of batting
6" X 9" – *size may vary


* adjust size to fit YOUR sewing machine foot, larger or smaller, as needed



1 Check to see which sides of your shelf liner are smoother (it may vary between brands). Put those two sides together and pin to hold them in place with a piece of paper behind them so that they will not stick to your machine bed.



2 Take your 2 1/2" binding and sew around the pieces of shelf liner.




3 Tear off the paper, saving the center portion for next step.

Turn binding to other side and pin or clip binding in place.



4 Place paper under the center section of your piece to help it glide over your machine bed. Stitch close to folded edge of binding.

Set aside.





5 Place scrap of batting on wrong side of fabric piece. Center along one of the short edges.

Roll the two pieces, from that short edge,

keeping the batting inside.






6 Fold raw edge in, giving a finished edge. Clip or pin to close the roll. Sew this long edge closed, hand sewing is recommended.





7 Fold ends under and sew to the Sewing Machine Foot Pedal foundation from step 4. Hand sewing is recommended.



Don't worry if your sewing is not the neatest, this is a project to use under your sewing machine foot. The most important part is that it will hold your machine foot in place!

Note: it will grip more than the floor and your pedal, it will collect stray threads, as well!
