### PALS Tentative 2022 Calendar of Events

May 2- Trunk Show & Class- Kathy Jolman

Kathy Jolman's class on "Indigo Dyeing". She is presenting a lecture and trunk show at our May meeting on Monday, May 2, 2022. The class will be on Saturday, May 14, 2022, from 10 am to 2 pm at Kathy's home (2552 White Road, Muskegon). \$55 per person / \$65 for non-members. Learn to set up a natural indigo vat. As it brews, you will learn some easy resist methods before dyeing your fabrics – clamping, bundling, and Arashi pole wrapping. When you leave, you will have some wonderful fabrics to use in a special quilt. This class will be outside in her backyard. Wear clothes and shoes you don't mind getting blue spots on.

<u>Materials list</u>: Bring <mark>3 yards of PFD cotton or cotton</mark> washed with Dawn soap and hot water, handdishwashing type gloves, and a lunch!

June 6- Quilted Memories presentation

Class for June 7, 2022-9 am to noon and 1 pm to 4 pm:

Penny Haren from Creative Grids (provided to PALS and the public by Jill Twiss McFadden of Quilted Memories). \$25 per person. Join us for an action-packed "Play Before You Pay" Creative Grids event. All rulers and fabrics are provided so you can make four to five different blocks -- and learn additional techniques -- in a fun and easy class.

Morning class will work on Scrap Crazy 6, Straight Out of Line, Ultimate Flying Geese and Kaleidoscope and Dresden Plate tools.

Afternoon class will work with 6" Log Cabin, Strippy Star. 8" Square on Square and 30 Degree Starburst rulers.

SUPPLIES FOR CLASS: Basic sewing supplies as well as sewing machine with 1/4" foot, rotary cutter, neutral thread. Cutting mats, rulers, fabrics, and pencils will be provided. Since you will only be sewing short seams, sharing a machine with a friend is not a problem.

2. Boutique is a fun job again for a bee or 2-3 people. It involves taking in and pricing the donations from guild members. They will be setting up the boutique room and handling sales during the show with volunteer help. The guild has a storage unit that items can be stored in until show time.

3. Set up and take down involves setting up the quilt racks at the church on Thursday morning and packing them up again on Saturday afternoon with the help of guild volunteers.

4. Show mom is a good job for 1 or 2 people. Your responsibility would be to arrange to have coffee/water and donuts for the workers on Thursday morning. You would also make sure a pizza lunch was available Thursday afternoon.

All these positions are important for another great show for PALS. We need everyone's help so please consider volunteering your time.
