August 1- Picnic- Elks Park

The August meeting will be our annual summer picnic at Elks Park.

Directions to Elks Park

*From Muskegon: Take Henry Street south to Porter Rd (corner by Pic 'n Pac), turn right, continue to Lake Harbor Rd, turn left, Elks Park will be on your right.

*From US 31: Take exit 107, Pontaluna Rd, turn west onto Pontaluna. Pontaluna will turn into Lake Harbor Rd. Elks Park will be on your left.

Bring a dish to pass for the picnic: A-L Main Dish, M-Z Dessert, we will eat at 6:45 pm. In addition, bring 6-5" squares, any color/design, to play Left-Right-Center games.

August Class

Sue Webb has been working hard to get materials ready for the August class; Barn Quilts, which she will be presenting on Saturday, August 13, 2022 from 9 am to 3 pm. It will be held at Roosevelt City Park located at the corner of Glenside Boulevard and Coolidge Road. A primed 2' X 2' plywood board will be provided along with painting supplies. There will be a limited choice of paint colors from which to choose. If you wish to bring your own paint, it should be an exterior paint. You will only need 2 to 4 ounces of each color you plan to use. As we will be outdoors, if it rains, class will be rescheduled. The cost of the class is \$65 for members and \$75 for non-members which is based on current prices for the plywood and other supplies.

Please bring a sack lunch, an old hair dryer and a painting smock or wear old clothes. Sign up will be available at the picnic.

September 12 - Lynn Carson Harris Workshop & Lecture

Our September 12th meeting will feature Lynn Carson Harris from Chelsea, Michigan. Lynn creates art, raises chickens, and grows vegetables. Both of her parents grew up on farms and like the little red hen in the children's story, she was taught to do things from scratch and to never let anything go to waste. Her thrifty upbringing led her to her current style of working with scraps and the desire to use "every last piece". Her quilts have been juried into international shows and gallery exhibits and her work is in private collections around the world. She is the author of "Every Last Piece" and has also been published in numerous books and magazines.

Lynn will be teaching her class, "Tiny Piecing-Precision Perfect" at Quilted Memories on Monday, September 12, 2022, from 9am until 4 pm. You will learn tips and tricks that make working small easier. She will show you how to piece tiny stars and other small blocks as well as small scale intuitive piecing. The class costs \$65 for members and \$75 for non-members. Sign up at August meeting.

Lighthouse Quilt Guild of Grand Haven announces their 2022 quilt show, "Of Sky and Sea," presented in conjunction with the annual Coast Guard Festival. The show runs Friday, July 29, 2022, to Saturday, July 30. Hours are 10 am to 5 pm Friday, and 9 am to 4 pm Saturday. Admission is \$7.00.

Our quilt show returns after a two-year hiatus. More than 150 quilts will be on display, including two quilt challenges: Original Medallion quilts created by members, and a Sky and Sea challenge, quilts done exclusively in blue and white to honor the show's theme. A number of vendors will offer fabrics and related quilting items, and the popular Guild Boutique is fully-stocked with bargains.

A Raffle Quilt on display has the same blue and white theme. Proceeds benefit The People Center, a local non-profit aiding families in stressful and emergency situations. Raffle tickets may be purchased at Field's Fabrics in Spring Lake, or at the show. Tickets are \$3 each or 2 for \$5. The winner will be drawn on Saturday, July 30, at 4:15 pm. You do not have to be present to win.






