## October 3- Breast Cancer quilt raffle, Donation Quilts and Trunk Show from Ladies of the Lake Bee

October is a busy month for Donation Quilts! We have three agencies that will each be sending a representative to our October meeting to accept our donated quilts: Every Woman's Place, Muskegon Pregnancy Services and Muskegon Rescue Mission. Two other agencies who cannot attend will have their quilts delivered: Catholic Charities and Department of Human Services-Foster Care. Soon the quilts we made will be wrapped around the moms and children we intended them for.

Ladies of the Lake is a quilt bee that began in 1990 when some women were introduced to each other and realized they shared a common love of quilting. The bee continues to meet on Wednesday afternoons in each other's home to this day, sharing their projects and their lives.

Ladies of the Lake trunk show will include photos documenting over 30 years of their quilting history including PALS activities, quilting retreats, quilting trips, charity quilts and special projects. They will also have lots of quilts to share from their block exchanges through the years.

### **Cancer Quilt**

This year's Cancer Quilt was made from pink fabrics donated by the membership a few years ago. A selection of lime and chartreuse green fabric were added to provide contrast. The pattern chosen is Sage from GE Designs. It was a fun pattern to work with using 10" blocks as a starting point, great for using up a layer cake or two. The finished quilt is 72" x 88" and it will be raffled off at the October 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting. Tickets are \$5 each or 3 for \$10, everyone loves a bargain. So, bring extra money to the meeting to help PALS support breast cancer research and maybe you will be the lucky person taking home a new quilt.

## **FACEBOOK**

If you are currently on FACEBOOK but are not following the PALS page, you are missing out. To follow, do a search: PALS Patchers at the Lakeshore. Then click FOLLOW. (It may be LIKE on some platforms) At the top you will see three dots ... click on that, a drop down menu with FOLLOW SETTINGS appears. Click on that and click FAVORITES, scroll down further and SAVE.

## **GROUP INTERACTION**

It might seem like you "liking" a post or commenting on a post isn't important. You could not be more wrong. Your little "like" matters!!! It's so simple, but vital to the success of this group. The interaction on posts is what ensures everyone in the group sees it. It keeps our group from falling into an "algorithm" and helps spread the word about things in this group to everyone in the group. A simple click on that "like" button on EVERY POST means everything and ensures that all group members see posts in their feed. Hitting that button on any post, in any group, is key to their group's success.

So maybe the post wasn't all that exciting, it's okay, but your "like" and comment helps ensure that people who might like it, will see it. Who knew a little "like" and comment that takes you seconds would be so important to a group's success. Our group has roughly 340 members. Our posts never reach all 340 members. Our "likes" on posts have rarely exceeded 15, which is great but not enough to make posts reach the entire group. Think of it as "let me help this post reach other members", "Thanks for the info", "let me help spread the word about quilting". Thank you for building up the engagement in this group by interacting on all the posts. It benefits all our group members as well as you.
