September 12 - Lynn Carson Harris Workshop & Lecture

Our September 12th meeting will feature Lynn Carson Harris from Chelsea, Michigan. Lynn is a quilt artist, raises chickens, and grows vegetables. Both of her parents grew up on farms and, like the little red hen in the children's story, she was taught to do things from scratch and to never let anything go to waste. Her thrifty upbringing led her to her current style of working with scraps and the desire to use "every last piece". Her quilts have been juried into international shows and gallery exhibits and her work is in private collections around the world. She is the author of "Every Last Piece" and has also been published in numerous books and magazines.

Lynn will be teaching a class on "Tiny Piecing" at Quilted Memories on Monday, September 12, 2022, from 9am until 4 pm. You will learn tips and tricks that make working small easier. She will show you how to piece tiny stars and other small blocks as well as small-scale intuitive piecing. The class costs \$65 for members and \$75 for non-members. 
Coopersville Quilt Exhibit
