A Quilters call for Help!!

Quilt Show

The quilt show will be here before we know it! Now is the time to start planning how you are going to serve the guild by volunteering to help put on the best show ever. Carla has put together some descriptions of the many ways our members can volunteer. Most positions will be about a 2-hour shift, and you are welcome to sign up for more than one shift.

Volunteer opportunities for the May 2023 Quilt Show (sign-ups begin at Feb. meeting) Volunteers do pay admittance fee for one day; no second fee if you volunteer for a second day!

Admission table: 2 volunteers/shift; volunteers are seated for this position; need to be comfortable handling money.

Raffle Ticket Sales: 3 volunteers/shift; 2 of the volunteers will be selling silent auction basket tickets (these sellers stand near the baskets); 1 volunteer will be selling tickets for the quilt raffle (this volunteer will be seated near the quilt). The 3 volunteers could rotate between the spots; all 3 need to be comfortable dealing with money.

Quilt boutique: 2 volunteers/shift to help in the boutique area. Volunteers work with the quilt boutique chairs and keep the tables tidy, room organized, and answer customer questions.

General Store: 1 volunteer/shift. This volunteer works with the General Store chair and helps keep the store neat and answer customer questions.

Bed Turning: 2 volunteers/shift. Volunteers will help hold up quilts for the presenter; presentation is approximately 1/2 hour.

Quilt drop off: 4 volunteers are needed to help the Registration chairs as they take in quilts. Volunteer duties include helping to refold (if necessary) and move quilts to the appropriate spot.

Quilt pick up: 4 volunteers are needed to help the Registration chair return the quilts. Volunteers will refold quilts and act as runners for the chairs.

Set-up and Hanging of Quilts: 12 -16 volunteers for set-up on Thursday, May 11. Set-up will begin at 9am and will continue until the quilts have all been hung (estimating 4-6 hours). Quilt racks need to be put together, drapes hung, and racks placed. Quilts are then hung with clips to the racks/drapes. This is more physical, and we appreciate the help of husbands, grown sons and daughters, grandsons and granddaughters.

Tear down: 12-16 volunteers for take down on Saturday, May 13. Take down will begin at 4pm. The quilts need to be taken down and given to the Registration Chair. Clips holding the quilts need to be removed, drapes need to be folded, racks need to be disassembled, and all racks and supplies loaded on the trucks. Again, this is a more physical job and we appreciate the help of strong husbands, adult sons, daughters, and grandchildren.

Keep in mind that we are still collecting items for the boutique. Also needed are donations for the raffle baskets.




