A Quilters call for Help!!

Hi, I just received a phone call from Ulana (coordinator for Ukrainians coming into Warren,
MI). They just got in 250 refugees. Of those, 120 are children so she asked if I had or could get more quilts. There will be another 250 refugees arriving at the end of January. I have 10 quilts on hand. If it is possible for any of you to make quilt tops no larger than 42 x 52 that would be great!!! I do not care what design is, or pattern or color. Just so long as it not larger than 42 x 52. (2 fit on long arm together). You can even use quilt panels for the quilt. I will be happy to quilt them if you can make the tops. I know that we will not be able to make 120 quilts in a month's time, but anything we can do will be wonderful for those children.

As you may recall, for the quilts earlier this year, we completed the whole quilt and then they were quilted by Annette Allen from our guild or members of the church quilted some. Annette leaves right after Christmas to winter in FL. Other quilt groups/sewers are also being asked to help. A few shortcuts and suggestions follow. Originally, we tried to make a dozen different patchwork blocks which took too-o long. We're totally open for ideas on how to produce quantity over intricate patchwork. Below are a few ideas, but anything you feel comfortable making will be great.

Some examples:

Easiest of all, have an appropriate children's design printed panel, add borders to suggested size of 42x52".

1. Three simple 12" blocks across by four down with 3" borders = 42x52" top

2. Twelve simple 9" blocks with 2" sashing & 3" border = 41x52" top

3. Use 6" squares - 7 across by 8 down = 42x48" or 6 blocks across by 7 down with borders for a 42x48" quilt.

4. An easy quilt is the Split Rail Fence. For those not familiar with this pattern, it is three light, medium & dark strips of fabric. For 12" blocks, cut 4-1/2" strips across the width of fabric. Sew strips together. Cut strips every 12-1/2" across sewn strips. Arrange 3 across, 4 down with dark giving diagonal look for 36" x 48". Add 3" border brings it up to 42x52" suggested size. Or, if you want to use smaller strips, you need 20 blocks to finish 9-1/2" block. Cut 3-1/2" strips. Follow above instructions to assemble.

5. Some of the earlier quilts we made used 3 block shapes: cut 12 of each of three: cut 4-1/2" x 12-1/2", 4-1/2" x8-1/2" and 8x8". Sew last two together to add to 4-1/2" strip for 12-1/2" block.

It would be helpful if you include coordinating back fabric and binding. If you don't have enough coordinating fabric, I'll check my stash. Batting is being donated by the Grand Rapids DAR. Cindy's group is quilting for us.

Other groups are being sent similar requests to help. If you have questions, please contact Betty. Let her know when you have a top ready so she can connect with you. Or she is open to other ideas where you might help during whatever time permits during this busy holiday season. She'll try to be as flexible as schedule permits.


the May 2023 quilt show. Joy will be glad to assist you with this.
