March 4-Laura Heine Collage Classes & Lecture by Certified Instructor Carrie Latesky March 3 & 4, 2024 PALS will sponsor Collage classes by West Michigan Certified Laura Heine Educator Carrie Latesky. Each day's class will use the Teeny Tiny #5 Pattern, which includes 3 designs: Tomato Pin Cushion, Dress Form and Featherweight Sewing Machine. Choose one design to create for class.

Class Fee is \$90 (Pattern is Included in Fee) Each person must have their own pattern. If you own this pattern already, Carrie will substitute with another Teeny Tiny Pattern. You must indicate which pattern substitution you want at registration so she can bring it to the class. Carrie also makes fabric kits specific to the designs. Kits are \$40 each - the background fabric is included. If you want a kit, it must be preordered and paid for at registration with the class fee. That total is \$130.

Classes will be held at Quilted Memories Inc, 9919 US HWY 31, Montague, Michigan. Class time is 9:30-4:00 each day. Doors open at 9 am. Please sign in first then finish preparation for class. You will need a bag lunch and beverage.

No sewing machine needed. You will need a Goddess Applique Pressing Sheet 17 x 24 or a Precision Fusing Mat 17 x 24 or larger, a small rotary cutter & mat (12x17), sharp scissors – Recommended: Karen K Buckley Blue Handled Perfect Scissors. Full Supply List will be given at Registration.

Quilted Memories will have Applique Fusing Mats, Karen K Buckley's Scissors and other supplies needed for this collage class for purchase before class. If you call owner Jill Twiss 231-893-0096 a few days ahead and she can have your selections ready.








Monthly activities

***The Basket Medallion Quilt** - There will be a choice of 4 patterns for the medallion to start. A \$2 fee covers printing to be paid at sign-up. The following 3 months, a new pattern can be picked up at the Resource table to complete your next 3 rounds. Scrappy or matching, the choice is yours. You can change or add to each round to make it your own & have creative fun!

***The Birds** will be a quirky raw edge applique and will be 9 BOMs. The first block & supply list will be available at sign-up with a \$5 fee for printing. Members who love applique are willing to provide a class to anyone who would like to learn this technique. A sign-up list will be ready so we can arrange a date, time, and space for a class.

The first pattern will be available for each Block of the month (BOM) at the February meeting.

She will present a trunk show of all kinds of bags and tell us about her journey to offer subscription boxes. Her shop is full of bright, beautiful, and unique fabrics and sundries for the special niche of bag-making.

The workshop is **All Things Tote.** The bag is beginner friendly and is perfect to bring along all items needed for a day of quilting including your water bottle. The class is \$65 and includes the pattern and all the sundries for the tote. You will need 1 YD of Focus Fabric, 1 Yd Lining Fabric and ¾ Yd for Binding. The Sundries include a Pattern, an acrylic bottom, straps, and bosal. Amy will also bring optional flip locks in finishes - antique brass, gun metal, iridescent and nickel at an additional cost. The option of a flip lock and choice of color can be ordered during sign up.


Threads of Friendship Quilt Show Kay Wilton, Connie Townsend, and Kathy Myers


Patchers At the Lakeshore AQS Ultimate Guild Challenge for 2024

EXTRA QUILT SIZES

SHORT 💥 CUT

To make the quilt in different sizes, follow the Cutting and Quilt Assembly Instructions here and refer back to pages 1 - 2 for the Block Assembly.

CRIB QUILT

Finished Size: 30 1/2" x 30 1/2"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- Four Fat Quarters Shop Fat Quarter Bundles at: <u>www.fatquartershop.com/fat-quarter-</u> <u>bundles</u>
- 1/2 yard accent fabric
- 1/2 yard binding
- 1 1/8 yards backing

CUTTING

- Cut four 18" x 20" rectangles into: 2 - 8" squares - 8 total (Fabric A) 10 - 3" squares - 40 total (Fabric B)
- Cut accent fabric into: 32 - 3" squares (Fabric C)

Cut binding fabric into:

4 - 2 ¹/₂" x width of fabric strips (Fabric D)


QUILT ASSEMBLY:

Make four Fat Quarter Four Patch Blocks.

Assemble Quilt Center.

Press rows in opposite directions.

Quilt Center should measure 30 1/2" x 30 1/2".



FINISHING:

Piece the Fabric D strips end to end for binding. Quilt and bind as desired.

Use $\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\mathcal{I}}}\xspace^{\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\mathcal{I}}}\xspace}$ use throughout. BLOCK ASSEMBLY:


Assemble Unit using matching fabric.

Nine Patch Unit should measure 8" x 8".



Assemble Block using matching fabric. Fat Quarter Four Patch Block should measure

15 ½" x 15 ½".



Make one from each fat quarter. Make twenty.
