*The Basket Medallion Quilt - There will be a choice of 4 patterns for the medallion to start. A \$2 fee covers printing to be paid at sign-up. The following 3 months, a new pattern can be picked up at the Resource table to complete your next 3 rounds. Scrappy or matching, the choice is yours. You can change or add to each round to make it your own & have creative fun!

*The Birds will be a quirky raw edge applique and will be 9 BOMs. The first block & supply list will be available at sign-up with a \$5 fee for printing. Members who love applique are willing to provide a class to anyone who would like to learn this technique. A sign-up list will be ready so we can arrange a date, time, and space for a class.

The first pattern will be available for each Block of the month (BOM) at the February meeting.

April 1st No Fooling! - PALS will hold a Garage Sale of quilting and sewing items April 1st. Tables are \$15 - members & \$25 - nonmembers. You may pay at the door. May 5th - Amy Shotwell of Sew Let's Be Quilty in Pentwater, MII will be our guest lecturer. She will present a trunk show of all kinds of bags and tell us about her journey to offer subscription boxes. Her shop is full of bright, beautiful, and unique fabrics and sundries for the special niche of bag making.

The Workshop is All Things Tote. It will be held on Sunday May 5th at Quilted Memories from 9:30 am - 4 pm. The bag is beginner friendly and is perfect to bring along all items needed for a day of quilting including your water bottle. The class is \$65 and includes the pattern and all the sundries for the tote. You will need 1 YD of Focus Fabric, 1 Yd Lining Fabric and ¾ Yd for Binding. The Sundries include Pattern, an acrylic bottom, straps, and bosal. Amy will also bring optional flip locks in finishes - antique brass, gun metal, iridescent and nichol at an additional cost. The option of a flip lock and choice of color can be ordered during sign up.

June 3rd - The Hoffman Challenge Trunk Show will be our program. This Trunk will be one of several that is touring the United States this year. This was a special challenge to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of The Hoffman Fabric Company, which is still operated by the Hoffman Family. Each item is made from fabrics designed for this special challenge. They are stunning. Don't miss it.

Quilts for Kids Rail Fence Quilt









Your kit should include the following:

20-2" x 42" strips of various fabrics


4-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" strips of Fabric A (for inner border)

4-31/2" x 42" strips of Fabric B (for outer border)

Assembling the Blocks:

*Remember - a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance is used for all seams.


1. Strip piece together 4 different 2" strips. Make 5 of these strip sets.




2. Sub-cut these strip sets into 30 units that measure 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ "x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



3. Create 1 row with 5 of the blocks as shown below. In these rows, turn the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} blocks one time. Make 3 of these sets.



4. Create another row with 5 blocks, but this time turn the 1st, 3rd and 5th blocks as shown below. Make 3 of these sets.



- 5. Attach the rows to create the quilt as shown below.
- 6. Attach the inner borders (1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips) and then the outer borders (3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips) being sure to first attach the side borders and then the top and bottom borders. Your guilt top should look like the diagram below.
- 7. Sandwich the quilt top, batting and quilt back, and baste the layers either with safety pins or needle and thread. Use only \(\frac{1}{8}'' \frac{1}{4}''\), LOW-LOFT batting. MACHINE quilt the layers together. This quilt will be loved and washed a lot so make sure that there is plenty of quilting to hold up to daily hospital washings. Quilt in the borders as well. NO HAND-TIED or HAND-QUILTED quilts, please!
- 8. Bind the quilt using traditional binding or by folding the backing to the front of the quilt. To use backing as a binding, cut the batting even with the top of the quilt and the backing an inch larger. Double fold backing to front of the quilt and topstitch. A zig-zag stitch will help keep binding edges down. Keep binding on front of the quilt to $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide.

9. REMOVE ALL PINS!

- 10. Sign the label with a permanent fabric marker. Place label on back of quilt and sew around all four sides.
- 11. Wash and dry the completed quilt. Ship the finished quilt to Quilts for Kids headquarters. Your quilt will bring joy to a child in need. CHECK FOR PINS!

Arrows indicate direction to press seams
